Vigilance and Enforcement department was constituted to inquire into cases of serious misconduct by Government employees and corruption related issues. V&E sends alert notes to various departments regarding irregularities that are likely to take place. It also takes up appraisal of activities and sends appraisal reports and system improvement notes. In a way V&E acts like eyes and ears of Government. V&E is headed by Director General (Police) and supported by two Directors and about 76 other senior officers and staff. Annually about Rs. 15 crores are the expenditure of V&E.

During last 10 years, V&E has inquired and submitted its report in 1230 serious corruption related cases pertaining to various department. Further it sent 768 appraisal reports, 1215 alert notes and 123 system improvement notes. Unfortunately, after sending its reports to Government there is no further follow up action by V&E. Taking advantage of this short coming various departments in Secretariat are just ignoring the V&E reports. In some case the reports are sent to H.O.D.s and that is the end of the matter.

In some instances, if any irregularity is likely to happen V&E alerts the respective department in Secretariat. The alert notes are not taken any cognizance and irregularity is allowed to take place.

Since last 10 years thousands of V&E reports have not seen the light of the day. Forum for Good Governance requested for information regarding disposal of V&E cases in Secretariat by filing R.T.I. application, the stock reply given to us is information not available. There is a deliberate attempt in Secretariat not to take required action as suggested by D.G., V&E.

V&E sends its reports after detailed inquiry / examination of cases. If timely action is not taken the tainted officials are likely to go scot free. In the state of Telangana there is no fear of punishment for wrong doing, 'sab chalta hai' attitude has developed in employees.

Common man is suffering from rampant corruption in administration. Without any fear the employees are openly demanding bribes. In HMDA, the bribe amount depends on the value of the land. If the land cost for which approval is required is high, the bribe is also high. With this, open (Khullam Khulla), bribes. People are loosing faith in administration. In the past we have submitted representation to Chief Secretary and H.E. the Governor of Telangana but there is no response.

Forum for Good Governance request the Hon'ble Chief Minister to kindly review the pending V&E cases and see that quick action is taken on V&E reports. Action may also be taken on officials who have not taken timely action on V&E reports.




